




Concepts for Flight Services Modernization

- Flight service remains primary advisory and flight planning link for GA, but service delivery is automated to the greatest extent possible
- Automated self-service briefings provided via web-based or remote access.
 Voice briefings will be optional by exception
- Web-based local area knowledge
- Flight path specific weather and aeronautical information attached automatically to flight plan by automation
- Delta Wx & AIM updates pushed to the pilot and specialist automatically
- Flight Plan Management Services extended to the network
- · Flight Tracking and Operational Information exchange
- · Alerts for flight plan closure and SAR initiation
- Voice-to-text & text-to-voice PIREPs
- ADS-B to enhance situational awareness for specialists
- <u>Use of low-cost, portable devices for display, processing, and advisory messages</u>
